Gregg wins 2015 Michigan Class A Championships: Jones ties for 3rd in Class C section!



Alan Gregg won the *2015 Michigan Masters-Experts-Class Chess Championships* held in Lansing the weekend of January 10-11, 2015. Capturing the Class A section championship outright, the perennial PHCC Champion notched 4 points, not dropping a single contest with a first round bye, wins over Thomas Triplett, Mike Smith, Justin Aldrich and a draw with Jennifer (Skidmore) Smith, Michigan Chess Association president. This represents the most recent Michigan Championship title

to find its way to the hallowed halls of the Port Huron Chess Club, two with Alan, which includes the 2010 Michigan Senior, and three with Lon Rutkofske which includes the 1982 Michigan Amateur, as well as the 1991 and 1992 Michigan Class A Championships. A rousing hurrah, "attaboy" and "Bravo" for Alan. You can share his excitement by playing over his games in the "members games" section. " Alan Gregg, a member of the Port Huron Chess Club, won the Class A championship at the Michigan Masters, Experts, Class chess tournament Jan. 9-11 in Lansing.

"I'm 70 now," he said. "I learned the game quite young, but I really didn't start playing until my 20s.

"I have an actual flair for the game. I'm probably in the top 50 in Michigan. In chess itself, I'm in the top 5 percent in the country."

In 2010, Gregg won the Michigan Senior title.

"At that stage I was in the top 100 in the USA over 65," he said. "I'm out of that now. My rating is dropping."

Players in Class A have ratings of 2,000 to 1,800. The class is one notch down from Masters — players with ratings greater than 2,000.

There were 141 people in the multi-class event at Lansing. There were 19 Class A players in the section that Gregg won."



G. Avery Jones managed to rack up 96 rating points on his way to a third place finish in the Class C section of the MX-Class Championships. This has been Avery's best finish in quite a while, although he is always challenging the top players in the club with his stubborn, creative playing style. Although not very forthcoming in sharing his games scores with your editor for inclusion here in **Chess Chatter**, he has become a fierce competitor and worthy rival in club level competitions. I am becoming

increasingly suspicious that this miserly behavior is an intentional ploy to prevent other club members from preparing against him. At any rate, a "Bravo" to you as well....Mr. Jones!

Bg6 6.f5?, e6! threatening Qh4 mate if White takes the B. If 7. Nc3, then the simple 7....ef5 destroys the White K-side and liberates the QB! The text move is a tempo waster and if Black had intended to use the Bishop sally, 3...Nf6 was the better choice of moves because the N at c6 prevents c5!] **6...e6 7.e3 g6** [Again, this seems to be a waste of time, and the B really belongs on e7. All this unnecessary maneuvering permits White good chances for improving his development.] **8.Bb5 Bg7 9.Bxc6** [This capture of the QN is pivotal in White's plan in the Bird, for the Black QB is really out of play on c6 and has no really good squares after 10.Ne5, and ends up back on e7 for the second time in order to preserve his Q-side pawn structure, more tempi lost!] **9...Bxc6 10.Ne5 Bd7 11.Ba3!** [A crucial move that really puts Black's plan in question. Bill thought for a long while here and decided on a time consuming knight's tour of sorts to h5, g3, f5 and finally to e7 all for the privilege of castling.] **11...Nh5 12.0-0 Ng3 13.Rf2 Nf5 14.g4!?** Diagram



[This was a rather risky line, because it greatly exposed my K-side to possible intrusions via the h-file, but thought the expansion was justified because the final destination of the KN was e7, effectively blocking the h4–d8 diagonal.] **14...Ne7** **15.Qf3** [In many variations of the Bird, the Q lands at f3, and since the Black's QB as effectively doomed to complacency, I felt this move provided additional pressure to Black's center and K-side. Truthfully, I felt Black's best bet here was to forego castling altogether since the closed nature of the position precluded any real mating threats and permitted him to untangle his forces.] **15...0-0?!** [Again, I thought this was a mistake to castle on the side where White was in the process of marshalling his forces.] **16.Raf1 f6?** [While this puts the question to the Ne5, it creates a host of targets for White's forces, and in the end, weakens Black's pawn structure. The N on e5 really is more annoying than anything else and a better plan was probably Rc8 followed up by c5!] **17.Nxd7 Qxd7 18.f5?!** [A rather double edged move, that puts the question to the Black forces but has risks for White as well. With the majority of Black's pieces aligned along his back two ranks, is it advisable to pursue a strategy that might liberate his opponents forces? 18...d5 just loses a pawn, and 18...e5?? 19. Be7, Qe7 20. Qd5+, Kh8 21. Qb7 loses two pawns. Bill finds a good rejoinder and effectively ruins my "fun"! **18...c6 19.Ne2** [Hoping to reposition my N to a better square.] **19...exf5** [19...e5! looks promising, and reshapes the possibilities for both sides.] **20.gxf5 Rfe8 21.Bxe7 Qxe7 22.fxg6 hxg6 23.Nf4** Diagram

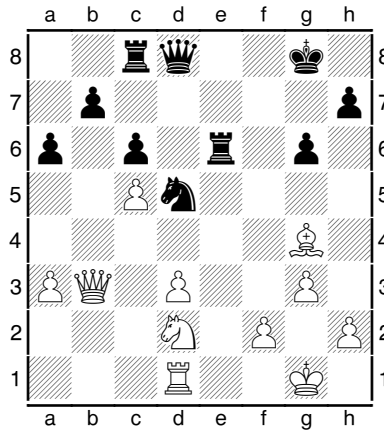

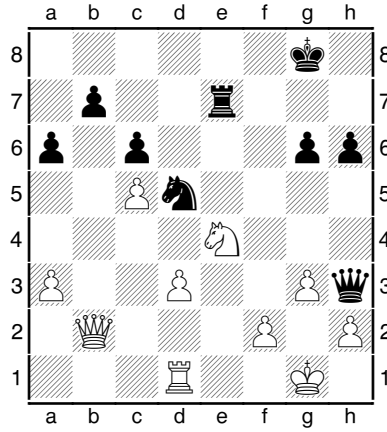

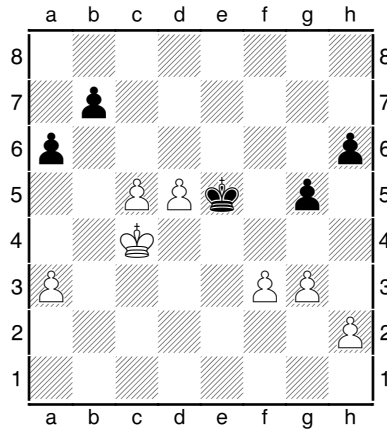
