Oh!...the Perils of the Action Tournament! By Lon Rutkofske

Although not nearly as fatal, in its own way, an action tournament might be likened to combat: “Half-an-hour of sheer boredom, punctuated by seconds of abject terror!”

I had the opportunity to participate in my first Michigan Action event on December 8, 2018, and found it a most enjoyable experience. Tournament conditions were more than adequate and in some cases even spacious. It was also my first experience at U of M’s Pierpoint Commons facility and I was duly impressed by both the expanse and expense incorporated into a rather luxurious facility provided by our hosts, featuring numerous food and beverage venues, shops and banking facilities that contributed to an almost mall-like atmosphere.

I had the pleasure of playing **Ray Garrison** for the first time ever in round two, each of us opting for a first round bye. A gregarious, affable player and premier chess coach, Ray proved a most gracious opponent, as he permitted me to pull victory from the jaws of defeat, even with my incessant series of nerve driven *faux pas* under time pressure.

As it turned out , I was equally blessed when facing **Raymond Burwell** in our 4th round contest facing off against his London System. I quickly liquidated, figuring I would have an advantage in an ending, base entirely on the misguided notion that my nearly 200 rating point advantage would mean something !? Reality struck home quickly as we rapidly proceeded to a very closed, drawish position by move 38 and “Ray had me right where he wanted me”...knowing full well, the fiction that was supposed to deliver me a victory , lead to my near demise, as I committed a horrendous blunder by dropping my d-pawn, and with it any hopes of victory. Fortunately for me, a hastily played opposite-colored bishops ending left neither of us satisfied, other than a welcomed handshake!

I'd like to say that I enjoyed a great tournament, but rounds 3 and 6 proved to be my undoing as **Salah Chehayeb** and **Manis Davidovich** had their way with me and my English Opening, wielding the black pieces with precision and patience, watching me crumble as time pressure mounted.

In all probability, the most solid performance of my action experience undoubtedly occurred in a round 5 contest where the youthful **Ethan Lyu** and I crossed swords, with the treachery and guile inherent in old age prevailing!

My compatriot in this sojourn to the southwest took the form of **Alan Gregg**. Ironically, I performed the driving duties, while the long time London "Cabbie", basked in the flora and fauna of the countryside, barking out occasional route adjustments. Currently sporting a 1900+ rating, Alan grudgingly bemoaned the latent unfairness inherent in the dual rating system of American action events that had cost him his expert rating a few years back, and has yet to recover...all the while vowing to make his showing in this year's rendition a stepping-stone in recouping those elusive points.

Had not fate intervened, our boisterous Briton was on the cusp of making his oath reality, notching three consecutive wins, and amassing 3.5 points after the first round bye. With his 4th round win in a time scramble against nemesis **Manis Davidovich** (Whose victory cost Alan first place in a previous action event.) But alas, Cassia is sometime a fickle mistress, and our intrepid colleague's trip to glory was blindsided by the likes of **Mauro Lopez** to whom he unceremoniously dropped his Queen, and then to **Salah Chehayeb**, whose opening preparation exceeded Alan's repertoire in a Scotch debacle.

All was not lost, as both Alan and I managed to eke out a few rating points, and felt a bit of vindication in that us "old guys" can still be a force to be reckoned with! I would recommend the Action to anyone interested in intense doses of the royal game, coupled with a smoothly run event, friendly competition, and an abbreviated schedule that will still leave time to enjoy other opportunities the rest of the weekend can provide. **(See Member's Games for game scores.)**

Rules & Regulations of Play for the 2019 PHCC Championships:

The following general rules and regulations of play will govern participation in this year's tournament. All participants should be familiar with these rules and any special rules that govern their play.

General Rules:

1. All play will be governed by the official rules of chess as established by the FIDE and USCF as given in the most current edition of the *Official Rules of Chess* published by the USCF.
2. Touch rules will be in effect in all games. Both players must record the moves of the game and submit properly completed score sheets to the

tournament director (TD) as soon as possible following the completion of the game. Illegal moves cannot be considered without accurate score sheets.

3. A chess timer (clock) must be used in all games. Time controls will be at the rate of "Game in 90 minutes with 5 second delay (1 and ½ hours plus 5/sec delay) per player. Mechanical clock time control will be game in 95 minutes and the clock will be set at 4:25. Prior to the beginning of the game both players are responsible for checking the clock to determine if it is functioning properly and set correctly. Sets and clocks can be checked out at the club, should players need to use club equipment. Players are responsible for correctly setting their clocks.
4. Only USCF and PHCC club members may participate in these events. Dues are payable to Lon Rutkofske.
5. Winners, or the player having the white pieces in the case of a draw, must report the results to the TD.
6. Disputes arising from play and unresolved by the players shall be submitted to the TD. His decision will be final. This year's TD will be Lon Rutkofske: 605 Lomasney Ln., Marysville, MI 48040 Ph. 810-388-9219 (Please leave a message with call back number) or email at ishking@aol.com.

Special Rules:

1. This year's event will feature a 5 round, Swiss System tournament taking place through the week of January 17th thru 20th, 2019. All games must be played at Palmer Park Recreation Center. A half-point bye may be requested prior to the commencement of play for the first round by contacting the T.D.
2. All games will be USCF and PHCC rated.
3. Rounds and Pairings: **The first round of play will begin at 7:00 pm at the PHCC on Thursday, January 17, 2019**; Rounds 2 and 3 on January 19th, and rounds 4 and 5 on Sunday, January 20th, 2019. Saturday and Sunday games will begin at 10:00 am and 3 pm respectively.
4. **Weather issues:** If the Port Huron Area School District is closed due to inclement weather, PHCC will be cancelled as well. **In the event of cancellation, the entire event will be moved to the following week beginning on Thursday, January 24th, and then on Saturday and Sunday, January 26th and 27th, 2019.** Please call or email Lon if you have questions before proceeding to the club. Lon will post information on the website and email participants as soon as conditions are posted.
5. A bulletin of completed games and results will be circulated within a week following the tournament. Please make sure that your score sheets are complete and accurate. Both players should submit completed score sheets.
6. Ties will be broken using the following methods in order: Median/Harkness; Solkoff; and Cumulative.
7. Prizes: All awards/prizes will be presented Sunday, January 20, 2019.
8. **Pre-Registration:** Begins December 1, 2018 and will continue through January 16, 2019. Entry Fees: Adult: \$10:00 Under 19: \$5.00 Onsite registration will require a \$10 additional fee. Contact TD Lon Rutkofske.
9. Awards based on 10 entries will be:
 - 1st Place - \$50 + Plaque ; 2nd Place - \$30 + Plaque;
 - Top Under 1700 = \$20 + Plaque
 - Biggest Upset - \$10

The following games represent contests that have been available at the time of this printing. Email them to me or give them to me personally, if you wish. Majority of analyses is done by Fritz 12, unless otherwise indicated. [This a reminder of the change in policy in the PHCC Challenge rules: # 14 - Games can be rated by the USCF, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.] Updated Challenge rules will follow below:

Format and rules for PHCC Challenge System

- I. Purpose: to provide club members the opportunity to challenge higher rated players on a regular basis to improve and test their skills in over the board non-tournament competition.
- II. Regulations: (Effective 11-8-2018)
 - a. Challenges may be made by any club member on the PHCC rating list under the following circumstances:
 1. Can only be made only by a lower rated player.
 2. Can only be made during club hours and cannot be made after 8:00PM.
 3. Must be played on the same day as the challenge was made, so there can be no advanced challenges.
 4. Both players must be present.
 5. Only one challenge may be made per meeting.
 6. Challenger can only challenge a player that is rated less than 400 points above him on the rating list.
 7. All challenges must be accepted.
 8. No challenge may be made while a participant is involved in a tournament or challenge game.
 9. A clock must be used with the time control of G/60 with 5 second delay; must be recorded by both players and submitted to the rating director upon completion of the game. (**See Sample Score Sheet on page 2**)
 10. All challenge games must comply with current tournament rules of chess as established by the US Chess Federation.
 11. No challenge game may be adjourned, but if an unusual circumstance arises, the club rating director may adjudicate.
 12. No member may be challenged more than one consecutive time by the same challenger. This means that the lower rated player cannot challenge the same player two times in a row. He/she must play another match before this can take place, but this also means that the higher rated player may be challenged by the same rated player consecutively if he has not participated in a match in between challenges within a six week period. Abuse (ie: Constant challenges and re-challenges or other annoying or inconsiderate behavior) must be reported to the Director and he has the option of suspending the violator indefinitely from participation in the Challenge system. Disputes will be adjudicated by the ratings director, with the advice of other players as he so wishes.
 13. Challenges can take place on the first Thursday of each month, or at any time there is no other tournament or event scheduled.
 14. **Games can be rated by the USCF**, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.
 15. Results will be rated by the PHCC (Using the USCF rating system.) using current PHCC ratings posted at the club and will be adjusted as necessary by the club rating director. Changes will also be posted on the club website.

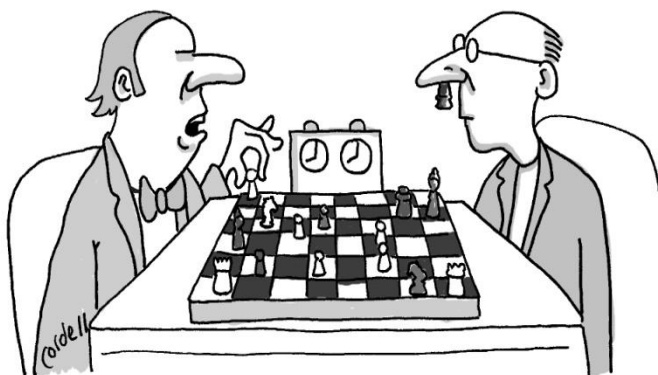

Calendar of Events:

First Thursday of Each Month - Chess Clinics- 6:30 to 7:00 PM - \$7.50 per person. From 7:00 until 10:00. Players wishing to play Challenge matches with longer time controls of G/60 with 5 sec delay can choose to play match games if they so desire. Participants will be required to follow the rules and regulations for **Challenge Play** (As outlined in Chess Chatter, our website under "Club Member Ratings Lists", or posted at the club.) and colors will be selected by lot. PHCC club ratings will be used. Players should turn their game scores into Lon, so he can adjust ratings appropriately and showcase the games in *Chess Chatter*. **Monthly Tournaments** will be held, usually on the third Thursday of the month, See the events schedule below for specifics!

2019 Events Schedule:

2019 PHCC Championships - Please note – **RULES AND DETAILS WERE RELEASED WITH THE DECEMBER EDITION OF CHESS CHATTER and on the PHCC Webstie.**

In an effort to resolve the typical concerns revolving around a winter schedule for the customary PHCC Championships beginning in January, this year’s plan aims to resolve this by hosting the event in a 5 round Swiss format, to be held on a single weekend beginning with the **first round slated for 7:00pm. on Thursday, January 17th and the final four rounds (two each day with rounds at 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.) on January 19th and 20th.** The entire tournament will be held at our Palmer Park site and conclude with the awards ceremony following the completion of the final round on January 20th. Amanda’s recommendation of reserving the following weekend (January 26-27) as a back-up is a

testament to the continued willing support of the PH Recreation Department.

If you intend to play, contact Lon before October 17th. (*Will be USCF rated if all entrants are USCF members.*)

November 21st – Duncan's 18th Turkey Gobbler Tournament "fun tournament": 6 rounds – featuring handicap speed, fixed positions, pre-selected openings, problem solving, G/15 events. EF\$ 5.00, prizes based on entries; Plaque for over-all champion: class prizes for each section (A fun event created by Bob Duncan in 1980.) ! Dues News:

While dues are not required for anyone interested in playing at the club, they are required for those competing in tournament play. Annual Dues are \$20.00 for adults and \$10.00 for those under 19.
