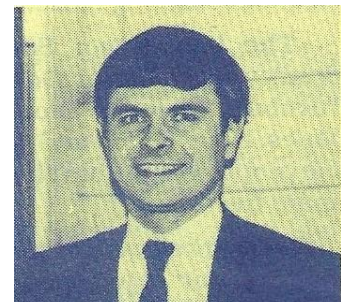
## Burziewicz makes it a clean sweep in claiming 2019 Speed Title

As always the number of rounds depends on the registrations and the format will be a Swiss, unless there are too few participants to make that work. Please let me know your thoughts, so I can make arrangements with the Recreation Department on dates in January, or early February. EF\$ 5.00, prizes based on entries; Plaque for over-all champion: class prizes for each section (A fun event created by Bob Duncan in 1980.) ! ## Members’ Games



*Please send me what you consider your best games, annotated or not, so that I might be able to showcase them. The following games represent contests that have been available at the time of this printing. Email them to me or give them to me personally, if you wish. Majority of analyses is done by Fritz 12, unless otherwise indicated. [This a reminder of the change in policy in the PHCC Challenge rules: # 14 - Games can be rated by the USCF, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.] Updated Challenge rules will follow below:*

### **Format and rules for PHCC Challenge System**

- I. Purpose: to provide club members the opportunity to challenge higher rated players on a regular basis to improve and test their skills in over the board non-tournament competition.
- II. Regulations: ( Effective 11-8-2018 )
  - a. Challenges may be made by any club member on the PHCC rating list under the following circumstances:
    1. Can only be made only by a lower rated player.
    2. Can only be made during club hours and cannot be made after 8:00PM.
    3. Must be played on the same day as the challenge was made, so there can be no advanced challenges.
    4. Both players must be present.
    5. Only one challenge may be made per meeting.
    6. Challenger can only challenge a player that is rated less than 400 points above him on the rating list.
    7. All challenges must be accepted.
    8. No challenge may be made while a participant is involved in a tournament or challenge game.
    9. A clock must be used with the time control of G/60 with 5 second delay; must be recorded by both players and submitted to the rating director upon completion of the game. **( See Sample Score Sheet on page 2 )**
    10. All challenge games must comply with current tournament rules of chess as established by the US Chess Federation.
    11. No challenge game may be adjourned, but if an unusual circumstance arises, the club rating director may adjudicate.
    12. No member may be challenged more than one consecutive time by the same challenger. This means that the lower rated player cannot challenge the same player two times in a row. He/she must play another match before this can take place, but this also means that the higher rated player may be challenged by the same rated player consecutively if he has not participated in a match in between challenges within a six week period. Abuse (ie: Constant challenges and re-challenges or other annoying or inconsiderate behavior) must be reported to the Director and he has the option of suspending the violator indefinitely from participation in the Challenge system. Disputes will be adjudicated by the ratings director, with the advice of other players as he so wishes.
    13. Challenges can take place on the first Thursday of each month, or at any time there is no other tournament or event scheduled.
    14. **Games can be rated by the USCF**, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (*Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.*) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.
    15. Results will be rated by the PHCC (*Using the USCF rating system.*) using current PHCC ratings posted at the club and will be adjusted as necessary by the club rating director. Changes will also be posted on the club website.

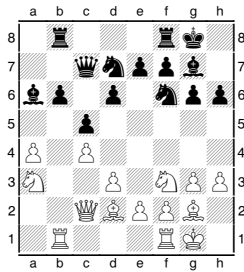
Challenge Match (1) Port Huron ,07.1976 ("Challenge Chess" column by Lon Rutkofske from Chess Chatter Vol. 5 No.5 - July 1976 pp.6-7.)

**[Phil Haley and I have locked horns in somewhat of a match as he prepares for the upcoming Canadian Open in Toronto. Your noble editor has been most fortunate in having his own way with the White pieces in two of our three**

**encounters. It seems the player with the Black pieces is doomed! Phil is now knee deep in a challenge game with "Dangerous Dan" Thomas and appears to have the upper hand in what is going to be a tough endgame. Good Luck!!**  
**1.Nf3 Nf6 2.g3 g6** [This was a very interesting contest in light of the fact that this was our first head to head encounter as can be seen by the relative calm in the first eleven moves. Caution was the keynote as each of us

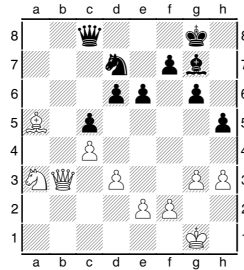
*was carefully sizing each other up. However, Phil found himself short of time (9 moves to make in about 5 minutes!) and I managed to win a piece. This was not the end however for in my haste to "end it all" I left my King exposed ! See what happens!]*  
**3.Bg2 Bg7 4.0-0 0-0 5.d3 c6 6.Nbd2 d6 7.c3 Nbd7 8.Qc2 Qc7 9.a4 a5 10.h3 h6 11.Rb1 Rb8** [This is the standard symmetrical variation. Usually these types of moves by Black will cause him trouble because

he is a tempo behind.] **12.b4 c5 13.bxa5 Qxa5 14.Nc4** [14.Rb5 seems much stronger, followed by Qb3 and all kinds of threats along the a and b files.] **14...Qc7 15.Bd2 b6 16.Na3 Ba6 17.c4?** [Diagram]

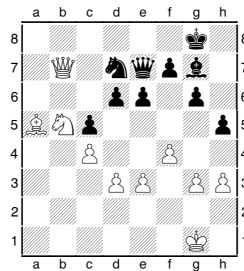


[17.Nh2 puts more pressure on Black's Q-side by preventing Ra8 and offering an exchange of white-squared Bishops at b7.] **17...Bb7 18.Nb5 Qd8 19.Rb3** [19.Bc3 helps the freeing move of Ne8 keeping Black's pieces tied down.] **19...Ra8 20.Ra3 Ne8! 21.Rb1 Nc7 22.Ne1 Nxb5 23.Rxb5 Bxg2 24.Nxg2 Qc7** [Black establishes equality with this move.] **25.Ne3** [This gives White's KN openings at d5 and g5.] **25...e6 26.Qa2** [Preparing to triple his pieces along the a file.] **26...h5** [Stops Ng4 and relieves the KB of its duty of defending the h-pawn. but gives White the extra tempo needed for the Q-side offensive.] **27.a5 bxa5 28.Rbxa5** [White gets what he wants, or...does he?] **28...Rxa5 29.Rxa5 Rb8** [Black hopes for counter-play along the b-file with a chance of the shot Rb2!] **30.Rb5 Qc8 31.Qb3 Ra8** [At this point the tide seems to be shifting in Black's favor, but time is on White's side as Phil has but 5 minutes to make the final 9 moves of the first time control. This was surely a big break for White, for Black needs this precious "thinking time" to mount his counter-attack. I began moving rapidly not affording Black the necessary time and all of a sudden, my pieces seemed to spring to life completely closing

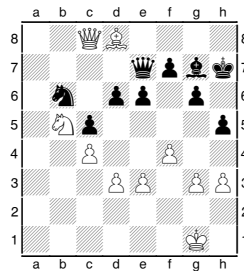
down the a and b files to Black's penetration.] **32.Nc2 Rb8 33.Na3 Ra8 34.Ra5 Rxa5 35.Bxa5** [Diagram]



**35...Qf8 36.Qb7 Qe7 37.Nb5 Bd4** [Hoping for counter-chances along the f-file.] **38.e3 Be5 39.f4??** [Weakening protection around the White King.] **39...Bg7** [Diagram]



[39...Bf6 looks like a saving move but 40.Bc7 Nf8 41.Nd6 Qd7 42.Bb8! leaves Black little hope.] **40.Qc8+ Kh7 41.Bd8 Nb6** [Diagram]



[41...Qe8?? 42.Nd6!! is crushing.] **42.Bxb6?** [42.Qb8!! is the answer here...if 42...Nd7 then 43.Qc7 wins the piece while keeping the Black Q under control along her back rank.] **42...Qf6 43.d4 Qf5! 44.Qa8** [The shot heard round the world for White's pieces are too far afield to return and protect his

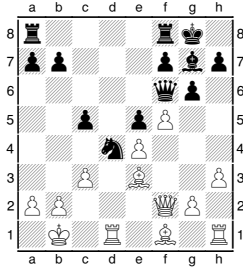
exposed monarch. It was at this point that White sealed a move. Things look bad for White 44. Qa8 (Not 44.Qc6 where d5! blocks and White's game falls apart.) Qb1+ 45. Kh2 hoping the White Queen can salvage the day via the h1-a8 diagonal. If 45.Kf2?? Qc2+ draws by repetition. 45...d5! draws easily after 46 Qa4, Qb2+ 47.Kg1, Qe2!] **44...Qxh3??** [The worst move possible!! Phil said that making quick moves after adjournment has been his greatest downfall. Lucky for me!!] **45.Qf3?** [45. Qg2 was much stronger!] **45...h4 46.Nxd6 hxg3 47.Qh1 Qxh1+ 48.Kxh1 cxd4 49.Bxd4 f6 50.Ne8 e5 51.fxe5 1-0**

**Haley, Philip - Rutkofske, Lonnie [B09] Pirc Defense-Austrian Attack Challenge Match (2) Port Huron 07.1976**

[This game seems to register as no contest as Phil dominates play, never leaving the outcome in doubt. In fact, Phil's play is so completely overpowering and my moves so passive that there is very little commentary, or retort for that matter to be offered by this author!! See for yourself!]

**1.d4 Nf6 2.Nc3 d6 3.e4 g6 4.f4 Bg7 5.Nf3 Bg4** [These are relatively the standard moves for the King's Indian, yet they seem rather inadequate here. I probably should have opted for a variation of the Modern Defense - ie: 1 e4 sg6 2.dr Bg7 3.Nc3 d6 4.f4 c6 defending against the Pseudo-Austrian Attack and maybe developing my KN to h6??] **6.h3 Bxf3 7.Qxf3 Nc6 8.Be3 Nd7?** [8...e5! looks superior here but after the exchanges at e5, Black is vulnerable to a host of threats from White's well-posted pieces.] **9.0-0-0 e5 10.dxe5 dxe5 11.f5 Nd4!** [Gets me into trouble, but I must free my

game!] 12.Qf2 c5 13.Kb1 0-0  
 14.Nd5 Nf6 15.Nxf6+ Qxf6  
 16.c3! [Diagram]

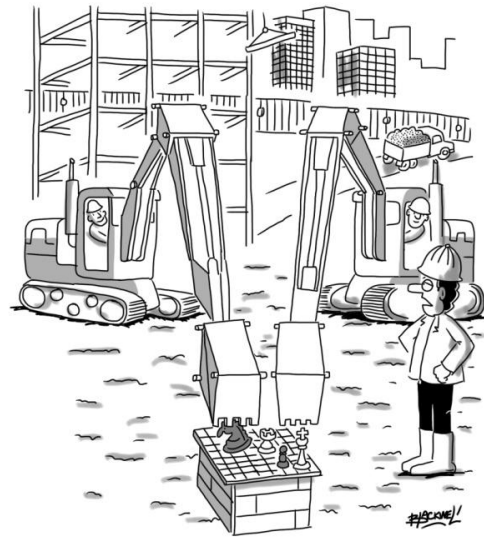


[There really is no adequate response to White's 16th move I lose at least a pawn in any case, so I tried to make it interesting by losing the game instead!] 16...Rac8 17.cxd4 cxd4? [The text move seals Black's Bishop into his K-side tomb. 17...ed gives White more options to go wrong, but it too is unsatisfactory as 18. Bf4 comes in and his Bishop pair rake the

Black position.] 18.Bc1 Qc6 19.Bd3 a5 [Things are hopeless!] 20.Bd2! b5 21.Rc1 [Taking the c-file away forever.] 21...Qb6 22.Rxc8 Rxc8 23.Rc1 Rxc1+ 24.Bxc1 b4 25.Qc2 Qd8 26.g4 Bf8 27.Qc4 g5 28.Bc2 h6 29.Bb3 Qe7 30.Qd5!! [Seals Black's fate.] 30...Qb7 31.Bd2 Kg7 32.Be1 1-0

## 1<sup>st</sup> Blue Water International Action Tournament:

### August 7, 1993- Lambton Mall-Sarnia, Ont.

## **SARNIA'S BRUZIEWICZ IS SHEER PERFECTION ENROUTE TO BW INTERNATIONAL TITLE**

**Millman-Shaune Share Second Place in the Lambton Mall Action Classic**

***Prizes galore and  
good turn-out  
insure Sullivan  
organized event's  
inaugural success***

If satisfied customers are any indication of success, the participants in the **First Blue Water International Action Chess Tournament** would have to give **Mike Sullivan's** organizing efforts a four star rating. Everyone ended up a prize winner!! "Of course the real key to the success of this first of a kind event has to be the efforts of **Susan Wright**, promotions manager of Lambton Mall." Says Sullivan. Susan was responsible for acquiring the wealth of prizes, providing the site and other accommodations and publicity that made this first tournament a rousing success.

Twenty avid Canadian and American chess fanatics signed up to go "head to head" in the Blue Water Area's first action event. The game in 30 minutes time control provided the fuel, but the players provided the fireworks for the myriad of curious shoppers and interested spectators that looked on and over the shoulders of contestants.

Both the Sarnia CC and the PHCC fielded numerous queries about our respective organizations as each club provided flyers, newsletters and signup sheets for interested enthusiasts.

**Andy Bruziewicz**, the BW area's premier speed demon, trounced all comers enroute to a perfect 6-0 score and the \$100 purse. Sarnian **Paul Millman** and Mt. Clemens' **Mike Shaune** shared second place honors

and \$80 with 4.5 points each. Their 3<sup>rd</sup> round draw put the squeeze on Port Huron's **Lon Rutkofske** who came up empty-handed at 4 points.

**Avery Jones** sporting a hefty new 1619 USCF Rating, recovered nicely from defeats in the first two rounds by mopping up remaining opposition in the final four rounds to reach 4 points with Lon and take home the top B cash.

**Bob Duncan** who was invaluable as co-director of the tournament netted 3.5 point, good for 2<sup>nd</sup> B and an upset prize. **Pat Forget**, complete with his "Easy Rider" ensemble took the C prize money and **Sam Carr** won the Unrated cash with three points finishing in the upper half of the pack.

Even a not so fresh **Mike Sullivan**, returning from a road trip to see the

Blue Jays in Toronto, managed a few Lambton Bucks sharing 3<sup>rd</sup> B cash with a pair of “Matts” –**Ryder** and **Morabito** . **Doug McLean** captured 2<sup>nd</sup> C and **John McHenry** and **Steve Mitro** split 2<sup>nd</sup> unrated money.

**Dorothy Moser**, the lone representative of the fairer sex, was the first to register and contributed greatly to the ambiance and lore of the event as she related stories about her father, a former Swiss Champion.

In keeping with the abundance of the event, she too was a winner and walked away with a seat cushion from Canadian Tire.

It was a particularly eventful tournament for me because I had a chance to visit with longtime friend and former PHCC'er “Gentleman” **Jack Heikamp** who no longer claims to be a gentleman since turning on to computer chess – somehow I just can't believe that! And the **Bob Klompstras** – both Junior and Senior – paid us a visit as well.

A great tournament, thanks Susan, Mike and Lambton Mall!
